2007



Helping Our Own Program is developed; the National Roofing Foundation Scholarship Program is revamped and renamed the Melvin Kruger Endowed Scholarship Program.

1998

Most Valuable Player Awards Program is created.

Best of the Best Program is developed and co-sponsored by Professional Roofing magazine and OMG Roofing Products.

2002

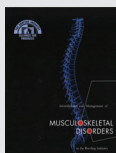
Funding is approved for Best Employment Practices for the Roofing Industry study.

2016

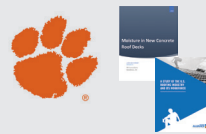
Project funding is approved for National Women in Roofing and development of NRCA ProCertification® and Training in Roofing Application Career.
